Suitable for: Children aged 4-11

Things You Will Need:

- Assorted coloured card
- Assorted size googly eyes (or draw them)
- Lolly pop sticks
- Scissors
- Glue
- Stapler
- Optional things to decorate: colouring pens, feathers, glitter, stickers, gems, buttons

How to Make Your Brilliant Bug Crafts

Here are some ideas to create your bugs, butterflies, bats and ladybirds! *Please note: Templates are at the end of these instructions.*

Lolly pop stick butterfly

1.) Cut out and decorate butterfly wings. Be creative with drawing, painting, add gems or buttons. Can you use a symmetrical pattern?

Top tips:

- Make the butterfly wings slightly smaller than the lolly stick- so there is enough space for little hands to hold the stick! [The butterfly template at the end of the instructions is the perfect size for this]
- Coloured card makes the butterfly look great.
- Decorative wasabi tape can be a simple way to add patterns!
- 2.) Attach wings to lolly pop stick
- 3.) Add eyes and curl strips of paper for antennae.

Top tips:

• You can curl paper for antennae by wrapping strips around a pencil- or ask an adult to help you use scissors to curl the paper strips.







Bug

1.) Cut out a circle (as a bug body). Colour the bug body and stick or draw eyes on



2.) Fold six black strips accordion style for the legs





3.) Curl two black strips of paper with a pencil (for the antennae)




4.) Attach a lolly pop stick to your bug so you can play and enjoy!







- 1.) Cut a ladybird shape out of black card, using the template provided here.
- 2.) Create a red circle for the wings and cut in half.



- 3.) Cut out small circles from the black card and glue to the wings. **Top tip:** try drawing around a five pence piece or penny to make the circle shapes.
- 4.) Position the wings on the body- you can use paper fasteners if you would like the wings to move.



5.) Glue on mouth, eyes, nose and antennae **Top tip:** strips of curled paper or pipe cleaners work well for antennae.







6.) Tape a lolly stick to the back, so it can be played with and enjoyed!






- **Bats**
 - 1.) Help your child place their hand on the black card and trace around their hands. Repeat with the opposite hand.
 - 2.) Cut the hand shapes out.



- 3.) Using the template, cut out the head and body for the bat
- 4.) Stick on the hand shapes you can use paper fasteners if you would like the wings to move.



- 5.) Add on eyes, a pom pom nose and a mouth.
- 6.) Finish by adding a lolly stick so you can play with your wonderful creation!








Birds

- 1.) Using the template, cut out a bird shape from coloured paper.
- 2.) Add a triangle beak using orange paper or a colouring pen.
- 3.) Add a googly eye
- 4.) Add feathers or decorations.
- 5.) Finish by adding a lolly stick so you can play with your beautiful creation!










Bug








